HOMework

- One piece of Literacy/Topic and Numeracy every week. Maths could be on mymaths, or written.
- To be handed out on a Friday.
- To be handed back in by Tuesday.
- Unless asked to produce loose work for a display, work should be written directly into the homework book, or stuck in neatly. Work should be in pencil, and handwriting should be neat and cursive.
- A research project will be given each term to run alongside our topic.

Spellings, Reading and Times Tables

- Spellings will be sent weekly. Spelling lessons happen daily and children will be tested once a week.
- Times tables – Regular practice as often as you can! They should be learned by rote, quick fire, games.
