Our vision

We believe every child deserves a high quality, inclusive early education, which provides the foundations for future learning. We want our children to feel happy, safe and secure to enable them to become independent, resilient learners.



Starting school in September

- ▶ Tuesday 3rd September – drop-in sessions with your child to familiarise yourselves with the classrooms – please sign for a time slot
- ▶ Wednesday 4th September – children begin part-time 9.00 – 12.00
- ▶ Wednesday 4th September – meet the teacher sessions – please sign up for an appointment.
- ▶ Monday 9th September – children stay for lunch – either school lunch or packed lunch. Drop off between 8.35 and 8.50, finish at 1.00
- ▶ During this second week, the children will stay for 1 full day, Tuesday or Thursday
- ▶ Monday 16th September children are full time



School timings once children are full time

- ▶ Drop off between 8.35-8.50. Gates close at 8.50
- ▶ Once the children are settled into school, they should be dropped at the wooden gate and walk around to their classroom.
- ▶ The school day finishes at 3.15
- ▶ Pick up is from the classroom doors.



What does a typical day in EYFS look like?

Morning

- ▶ Children come into class and organise their belongings/table-top activities
- ▶ Register and lunches
- ▶ Carpet session – phonics
- ▶ Child-initiated learning
- ▶ Review
- ▶ Snack
- ▶ Focused teaching session – maths- followed by linked activities
- ▶ Story
- ▶ Lunch



What does a typical day in EYFS look like?

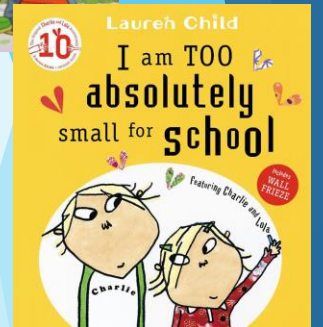
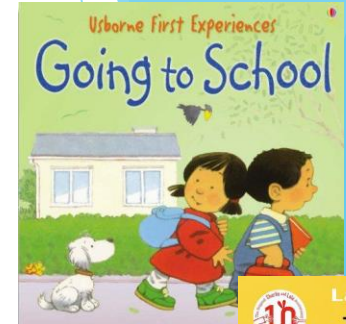
Afternoon

- ▶ Register
- ▶ Carpet session- Understanding the World
- ▶ Child initiated
- ▶ Review
- ▶ Story
- ▶ Home time.



How can I prepare my child for school?

- ▶ If your child does not attend a pre-school try and organise occasions where they experience separation from their main carer (play dates) for a few hours.
- ▶ Read stories about starting school
- ▶ Talk about starting school – worries, things that excite them etc but be positive.
- ▶ Decorate a shoe box and encourage your child to choose some special items to put inside. These can then be brought into school to share with your child's new teacher in September. Your child will receive a postcard during the holidays to explain this, please do not tell them yet as we would like the post cards to be a surprise!

Practical ways to prepare your child for school

- ▶ Independent toilet training
- ▶ Practice washing hands independently
- ▶ Practice getting changed independently
- ▶ Clearly label every item of clothing
- ▶ Make sure your child can recognise their own name – personal symbol
- ▶ Spare clothes in their PE bag
- ▶ Encourage your child to drink water if this is not their preferred drink – refrigerate
- ▶ Encourage your child to try different fruit and vegetables – snack provided by school
- ▶ Practice eating with a knife and fork – cutting up food
- ▶ Reinforce that special toys/blankets must stay at home

What will my child need each day?

Book bag - please do not send ruck sacks as we do not have the space to store them during the day

Named water bottle - water only, no juice. Bottles are refilled as needed throughout the day

A named coat - we go outside as often as possible

PE bag - these are left in school and only taken home when needed for example washing

Spare underwear and clothes in case of accidents

Reading log book and reading book - provided by school



EYFS Statutory Baseline assessment

- ▶ During the first 6 weeks, teachers will carry out a baseline assessment with each child.
- ▶ Checks early literacy, communication, language and mathematics skills when they begin school.
- ▶ Uses materials that most children of your child's age will be familiar with.
- ▶ Practical tasks and an opportunity for teachers to get to know what your child can do.
- ▶ Measures progress between EYFS and Year 6.

- ▶ A positive attitude to school and learning.

- ▶ Being independent and motivated with learning.

- ▶ Being determined and resilient learners.

- ▶ Setting a good example to the rest of the school.
- ▶ Demonstrating excellence in behaviour, attitude and learning.



Behaviour expectations

As per our behaviour policy, we band behaviour accordingly. Whilst our approach is always restorative and preemptive, when we do encounter behaviour that doesn't meet the high-expectations we have, the following measures/procedures are considered:

- ▶ A class behaviour chart is used – sunshine and 'wow', raincloud and 'oh dear'. Each day is a new day.
- ▶ Age-appropriate sanctions are used – calm down time
- ▶ Behaviour reported to parents at the end of the day.
- ▶ All unwanted behaviour is be taken seriously. Despite children's developmental stages, 'wanted' behaviour needs to be reinforced.



Home learning

- ▶ Children will be given a reading log to record their home reading.
- ▶ Reading logs will be checked and books changed twice weekly – Tuesdays and Fridays.
- ▶ The children will bring home a library book for you to share, weekly.
- ▶ Home learning is sent home on Friday and should be returned by the following Friday.
- ▶ Messages via the year group email, or urgent messages e.g. changes to pick-up via the office.



School uniform and PE Kit expectations

- ▶ In September pupils needs to return in winter uniform.
- ▶ One pair of stud earrings only. Please remove on PE day
- ▶ School shoes not trainers are to be worn
- ▶ Bows should be navy or school yellow and no bigger than the palm of your child's hand. Hair below shoulders needs to be tied back.
- ▶ Blue P.E. t-shirt, blue or black shorts, plimsolls or trainers. No jewellery should be worn.
- ▶ If your child is unable to take part in P.E, please send an email to explain why.
- ▶ Ensure items of clothing, water bottles, coats, hats, bags etc are named

Punctuality

- ▶ As well as regular attendance, punctuality is also crucial.
- ▶ Learning begins as soon as the children enter the classroom.
- ▶ Being 10 minutes late every day equates to 5 days of lost learning over the year.
- ▶ Regular attendance and punctuality are important values to establish for beyond education.



Wrap around care

- ▶ Breakfast club arrive from 7.30am – 8.00am.
- ▶ Cost £3.50
- ▶ Book in advance, places limited
- ▶ After-school club 2 sessions
- ▶ Pre-book through scopay
 - ▶ 3.15pm - 4.30pm – cost £5.50
 - ▶ 3.15pm – 5.30pm – cost £10

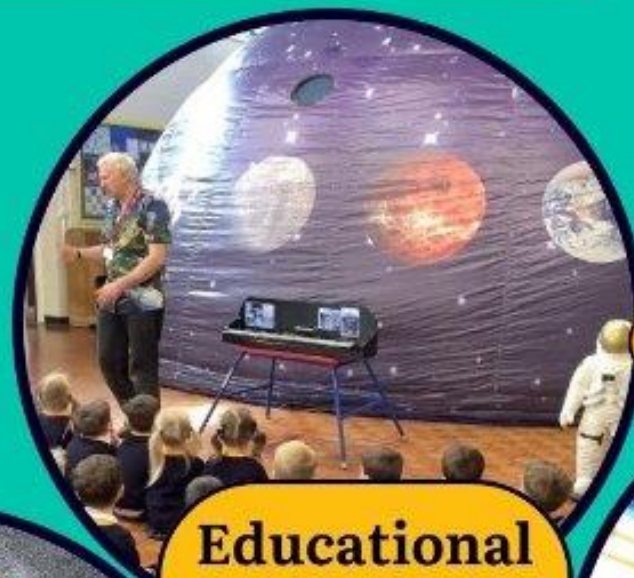
