Where Children Come First

Computing

This term we will be learning core skills, which enable children to understand how to use programmes, the internet and internet safety. How the Internet fits into their lives and used for communication and collaboration.

P.E.

This term the children will be to describe basic fitness components. Children will be describing how and why their bodies change during and after exercise. They will also explain how often and how long exercise should be done for to remain healthy. Children will complete:

Art/DT

In DT this term, we will be investigating structural design alongside learning about volcanoes and earthquakes in geography. The classes will be using triangulation to understand strength in buildings to make earthquake proof structures.

PHSE

In PHSE this term we will be looking at the physical and mental changes that happen during puberty, as well as understanding basic hygiene and how to look after your body.

We will also discuss emotions and feelings around transitioning into Year 6.
