Attendance

The new guidance titled 'Working together to improve school attendance' came into force on 19th August 2024. 
Pride Certificates




The children officially started school on Wednesday and we were so impressed with how well the children came into school on their first day, saying their goodbyes and looking very smart in their new school uniforms. Already we have begun to learn the class routines, from answering our names in the registers, to practicing our 'star' sitting on the carpet. The children are all enjoying exploring the different areas within EYFS and getting to know their new classmates and staff. Next week we are looking forward to staying for lunch. 














This week, year 1 have settled really well into their new routines. We have been so impressed with how calm, happy and keen they have been to get going with all of the new learning opportunities. In English, we have begun learning about what makes a sentence and explored our first text of the year 'The Three Little Pigs'. In maths this week, we have been sorting and classifying objects and matching them to the correct numeral. We have been exploring different ways that we can sort; by colour, by shape, or perhaps by another feature like how many sides. During exploration time, children have had an chance to choose resources from our shared area as well a have a try at challenges linked to our maths learning. For our new geography topic, we have explored our year 1 area and completed aerial maps of its layout.





Year 2 have had an amazing first week back at school! They have settled well into the new routines and are beginning to follow our STAR behaviour expectations with confidence.

This week in English we have started our new text 'Paddington'. The children wrote predictions for the plot, before we then read the story. The children then used adjectives to describe Paddington's appearance and behaviour. We're really enjoying this text already and can't wait to do more writing based on it.

In maths we have started the term by looking at counting up to 100 in tens and using dienes to show 10s and 1s.

In Geography we have begun looking at the countries which make up the United Kingdom as well as the capital cities.







The year started with our Year 3 pupils revising their learning of word classes in English, but identifying and using nouns and adjectives in sentences. Within maths, they have been looking at numbers up to 100, and partitioned 2-digit numbers into tens and ones. Within humanities, children have begun their unit comparing Staplehurst and Tonbridge by looking at maps of the village to locate their homes. They then considered what they see on their journey to school and identified human and physical features, before drawing their own maps.








YEAR 3

We have all had a fabulous start to year 4. We are spending time in class setting expectations and reminding children of the learning behaviours they need to be successful. We kicked off our new History topic on Tuesday with an Introduction to Ancient Civilisations. The children enjoyed looking at coins, buildings and masks of different ancient civilisations. They used their knowledge of BC and AD to help label ancient civilisations on a timeline.

In English we have been introduced to our new book 'The Queen's Nose' and have learnt about the main character Harmony and written descriptions about her appearance and her personality.

In Maths we have been partitioning numbers up to 1000 in to hundreds, tens and ones.











YEAR 5

In English, we have revised our punctuation from last year making sure we remember those essentials of capital letters and full stops, ensuring our sentences make sense and using adverbs and adverbials. We began our new book 'Who let the gods out?' which is hilarious and we cannot wait to read on!

PE started strong this year with ball skills in 5B and balancing in 5T - we always have fun during PE but this was a real challenge this week.






What a fabulous start to the final year of primary school for our new Year 6 cohort. It has been great to see the children return with such positivity!


All children completed House Captain applications after thinking of reasons why they should be chosen. The house captains will be announced in next weeks newsletter.


In English, this week the children have learnt and used figurative devices to describe settings. These skills will be used to describe a setting based on our new class text 'Holes' by Louis Sachar.
